

Cremated remains should be shipped in a funeral urn.

When shipping an urn, choose a box that is the right size and in which the urn cannot move around. If necessary, use bubble wrap or newspaper to fill the box. Pack the urn well making the package as neat and even as possible. Do not mail an urn in an irregularly shaped or round package. The outer packaging must be able to withstand the transport load. If necessary, select the Fragile additional service.

The cremation certificate should be easily available. For example, it can be enclosed in an envelope and fastened well with tape to the outer packaging. If the urn is to be sent abroad, the sender must check for any possible permits required by the law of the receiving country.
